Course Description:

HTM 150 Basic Horsemanship & Equitation Skills: Provides each student with one gentle-broke horse to work within the following: English & Western riding; showing in halter; grooming properly; standing still while being saddled, bridled, and mounted; working on the rail; taking proper leads; backing and loping in circles, stopping, and two-tracking. The students will also receive instruction in basic hoof care and proper stable management.

 - A. Groom horse
 - B. Blanket and saddle horse
 - C. Bridle horse
 - D. Mount and dismount properly
 - E. Learn basic riding skills
 - F. Lope circles & figure eights
 - G. Learn to take correct leads
 - H. Stop and turn horse
