

CNCC Part-time/Adjunct Nursing Instructor:

Position objective: A nursing faculty is responsible for teaching, guiding, monitoring, and evaluating student learning in the classroom, laboratory, and clinical settings. Faculty will direct the students with hands-on instruction in needed skills to be successful in the nursing profession.

Primary duties:

- Provide one-on-one guidance in the clinical setting to meet the individual needs of the nursing student.
- Provide theoretical, lab, or clinical instruction which reflects an understanding of the program's philosophy, objectives and curriculum.
- Participate in the development of clinical evaluation tools and paperwork.
- Evaluate student achievement of curricular objectives and outcomes related to nursing knowledge and practice.

Expectations:

- Provide pro-active teamwork with college staff.
- Provide a positive attitude with a willingness to accept and promote change; be open-minded, fair, and show consideration of multiple perspectives; show an ability to accept responsibility for personal/professional growth.
- Lead and follow well, accept criticism, handle conflict, and motivate others.
- Commit to cooperation, consensus building, collaboration, effective goal-setting and evaluation.

Special conditions:

There may be occasional long and irregular hours necessitated by clinicals and compliance with deadlines. Some travel involved for training, clinicals, and professional meeting activities.

Position location:

CNCC nursing classrooms and clinical sites.

Performance indicators:

- Completion of primary duties
- Meets expectations
- Evidence of effective communication
- Satisfactory student and DNEP evaluations

Requirements:

- Master's Degree in Nursing or written plan demonstrating ongoing progression in obtaining a Master's Degree in Nursing
- Two years of full time professional nursing clinical experience.
- Current Colorado license in good standing to practice as a Registered Nurse.
- Current CPR for Healthcare Provider
- Clean background check

Salary:

Consistent with academic preparation and experience.

This position is to begin with the spring semester, or January 7, 2010.
