
This check list is a guide to help applicants meet the Nursing Program application requirements. Since each person comes with a unique background and interests, this is only a guide. We encourage you to look carefully at the Nursing Program website:

- Apply to CNCC via the admissions office.
- Transcripts: Request transcripts taken at any non-CNCC college or university to be sent to the CNCC Registrar (electronic versions are fine):
CNCC - Office of the Registrar; 500 Kennedy Drive; Rangely, CO 81648
- Complete prerequisite courses:
 - Complete or be in the process of completing at least **18 credits of the General Education prerequisites** with a GPA of 2.8 or above for those credits. (Courses are listed on back of this page.)
 - Courses must be completed by the end of the SPRING semester of your application.
 - Fill out "In-Progress Course Grade Form" to submit with your application.
- Complete the entrance exam before you apply:
 - To take the "Test of Essential Academic Skills" (TEAS) at CNCC, schedule a test date by calling 970.824.1104 or emailing darby.mcdermott@cncc.edu.
 - Test dates are posted on the CNCC Nursing Program website.
 - Pay the \$55 fee at least THREE days in advance of the test date at the CNCC bookstore.
 - Go to www.ATItesting.com (search "TEAS") to choose and purchase the TEAS Study Manual 6th Edition (Study guide and practice tests). Contact Darby McDermott for information about practice tests.
 - If you take the TEAS at another location, have the score sent to darby.mcdermott@cncc.edu.
- Apply to the Nursing Program.
 - Submit the application via email to darby.mcdermott@cncc.edu or deliver/mail to the Nursing Program office.
 - Submit **unofficial transcripts** with your application.
 - Applications may be submitted from January 1 through April 15.
 - Due date/Time:
 - Hard copy applications are **due by 4 PM on April 15.**
 - Electronic applications are **due by 11:59 PM on April 15.**
- Note: If you are conditionally admitted to the CNCC Nursing Program, you will be required to pass a criminal background check and drug screen. Disqualifying offenses are on the website.

CNCC AAS Degree Requirements for Nursing Program

➤ Required Pre-Requisites

The following prerequisite courses are required for the AAS Nursing degree. A minimum of 18 credits are required for admission to the Nursing Program. *GPA of 2.8 or higher is required in the following prerequisite courses:*

- ENG 121 Eng Comp (3 credits)
Must meet these criteria to take ENG 121:
ACT Reading > 18 or Accuplacer; SAT Reading > 440 or Accuplacer; Accuplacer RC 62-79 and or SS score of 70-99
- PSY 235 Human Growth and Dev (3 credits)
- BIO 201 Human A & P I (4 credits) *Must be completed within seven years prior to admission.*
- BIO 202 Human A & P II (4 credits) *Must be completed within seven years prior to admission.*
- BIO 204 Microbiology-with lab (4 credits) *Must be completed within seven years prior to admission.*

➤ Required Non-Nursing Courses - May be completed before or *during the program:

- BIO 216 Pathophysiology (4 credits). **Must be completed prior to NUR206*
- Nutrition - **Must be completed prior to NUR106.*
HPR 108 (1 credit meets AAS-N requirements, not BSN)
HWE 100 (3 credits transferrable to BSN)
- MTH 103 Clinical Calculations (3 credits) - **Must be completed prior to NUR106*
Must meet these criteria to take MTH 103:
ACT Math >19 or Accuplacer; SAT Math >460 or Accuplacer; Accuplacer EA >61; MAT 090,099, 050,055
- Arts or Humanities (Elective 3 credits) - Choose one of the following:
AH1: ART 110,111,112,207; MUS 120,121,122; THE 105,211,212
AH2: HUM 115,121,122,123; LIT 115,201,202,205,211,212,221,222,225
AH3: PHI 111,112,113,114,214,218
AH4: FRE/GER/ITA/JPN/RUS/SPA 211,212; PSY 101,102,226,227,249; SOC 101,102,215,216,237
